In an ongoing effort to protect and support the students at Jamestown School District, we are proud to announce our partnership with STOPit Solutions, a nationally recognized leader in school safety and wellness.

Through this partnership, everyone in our school community has access to the STOPit anonymous reporting app – a powerful tool designed to deter and promptly address instances of bullying, school violence, self-harm, and inappropriate behaviors. With the STOPit app, users can anonymously submit tips, attach photo or video evidence, and privately message school leaders with the necessary information to help everyone involved.

In addition, when a student or anyone in our school community needs immediate support, the STOPit app provides direct access to the Crisis Text Line. Users can anonymously text with counselors (day or night) until they feel safe and calm. We encourage everyone in our school community to download the STOPit app. If you haven't already done so, we kindly urge parents and guardians to download the STOPit app and become familiar with its features. This will not only enable you to guide your children in using the app but will also demonstrate our collective commitment to the safety and wellbeing of our whole school community. The STOPit app is available on the Apple App Store and Google Play Store.



Dear Parent or Guardian,

At Jamestown School District, we believe that communication is key in promoting the education, safety, and wellbeing of our students. It is for this reason that I want to share some general information about head lice. As children come back to school, we occasionally have an influx of cases. We also have plenty of little ones who share hats, clothes, costumes, etc. Please take a moment to read general precautions against head lice.

Headlice is generally spread through head-to-head contact, but can also be transmitted from one person to another by sharing combs, brushes, clothing, hats, and bedding. Anyone can get head lice, and it is not a reflection of hygiene or social status.

The Governing Board of Jamestown School District recognizes that head lice infestations among students require treatment but do not pose risk of transmitting disease. If a student is found with active, adult head lice, they will be allowed to stay in school until the end of the school day. The parent/guardian of any such student shall be given information about head lice treatment and encouraged to begin treatment of the student and any infected members of the household immediately. If a student returns to school on a subsequent day and continues to have head lice, the student will be sent home for subsequent treatment.

We ask that you please do your part to prevent the spread of this communicable condition by checking your child(ren) for head lice daily for the next few weeks, and on a regular basis thereafter. If you discover that your child(ren) has head lice, please notify the school immediately. There are many lice treatment shampoos on the market as well as other mechanical and manual methods of controlling the lice. Bedding, clothing, and hats should be laundered in very hot water (120 degrees) on the same day or evening your child is treated. Nits (lice eggs) are tiny, white, pearly eggs that attach themselves to the hair shaft close to the scalp. The nit can be removed manually by pinching between two fingernails and pulling it off the hair shaft, or by using a "nit comb", available in most pharmacies.

As always, we thank you for your commitment to your child's education. We appreciate our school community and the honesty and integrity of the communication between home and school. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to communicate with the Jamestown Elementary School office.

 - o These skills are taught alongside Responsibility, Courage, & Perseverance
- Be Well: Skills that help students handle their emotions and deal with stress.
 - These skills are taught alongside Gratitude, Honesty, & Creativity

This year, you'll be invited to join the fun! We will send letters home about the skills and strengths being taught each month. Each letter will include some ways to build these skills at home, discussion starters, and fun challenges you can try with your family.




